# **Church Council News - April** Council discussed the 2017

Council met April 10 at 7 p.m. in the church library. Preparation for the congregational meeting/focus group session dominated the discussion. Council narrowed down three questions to focus on during the group sessions.

After that session, council hopes a vision for where the church goes next and how best to staff for that will be clearer, so that a timeline can be developed.

Council discussed the 2017 endowment disbursement, and decided to allocate it as follows:

- \$3,000 for a donation to Lutheran Family Services that will be matched by an anonymous donor
- \$1,000 for supporting Matt Leonard's seminary education
- \$2,000 to fund a scholarship for Global Mission's upcoming trip to Malawi.
- \$4,000 for capital improvements
- \$6,000 to develop and fund social media work

Dan Radmacher agreed to work on coming up with a strategy for improving St. Philip's social media outreach to better communicate the church's mission, ministries and activities. This may involve hiring someone well versed in social media, as well as paying to boost social media posts.

Pastor David thanked outgoing council members Candace Underwood, Max Hollins, Paul Henkel, Dan Radmacher and Nick Muir.

The next council meeting will be May 8 at 7 p.m. in the church library. Anyone is welcome to attend.
