Church Council News -December 2019

Council met on Tuesday, December 10, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. in the church library.

Peter Shick, Treasurer, distributed the Treasurer's report for month ending November 30, 2019. The Treasurer's report showed receipts for month ending November 30, 2019 of \$24,740.73 and our year to date budget under \$5,220.06. Mr Shick stated we had no extra expenses in the month of November.

Mr Shick reported the drain for the storm water detention pond had been repaired and he had not yet received the bill from C & M Industrial Maintenance. Roanoke County Community Development will return in the near future to inspect the repairs.

Mr Shick reported to council Mr Dillman had not yet received a

proposal to strip and clean the floors in the hallway, kitchen and bathrooms. Mr Shick reported Mr. Dillman is hoping to receive the proposal soon as he would like to have the work done during the preschool's Christmas break.

Pastor David reported mid January B&D Locks will rekey the locks on the church doors and install a box with a passcode near the door at the kitchen to be used to enter the church for functions when the church is not open. Keys will be limited to church staff and will not be able to be duplicated. Members of the congregation with a key will still be able to use their key inside the church to unlock the office and closets when needed.

Council continues work on the Guidelines for Endowment Donations. An attorney has reviewed the draft of the document and made suggested changes. Council will continue work on the document in January and will

present the completed document to the congregation in April.

Council approved the 2020 Proposed Spending Plan. This will be presented to the congregation for approval at the congregational meeting on December 15, 2019.

Contributions to the church staff for Christmas are due by December 20, 2019. Cash or checks can be given to Gary Sahm or Peter Shick.

Pastor David and Pastor Laura reported several new ministries will be introduced beginning in January 2020. More about these will be discussed in the January newsletter. Council approved an endowment gift of \$2,501.00 to Hope Lutheran Church in Arcade, New York capital campaign to construct a multiuse facility to be used as a ministry and community center.

The next council meeting is January 14, 2020 in the church library.

The Key To Change Is To Change the Key

I am not quite sure this is true, but the pastors and church council want the congregation to be aware that starting mid-January, the three exterior entrances to the St. Philip facility will be re-keyed Since our building was constructed in 1993 the locks have remained the same. Over the years, one of the growing ministries at St. Philip has been opening our facilities to church members, ministry groups, and local non-profit organizations. We

very much want that ministry of hospitality to continue.

Once locks are changed, entrance into the building will happen through the side doors where a coded box will have a non-duplicatable master key to get into St. Philip. Any member of St. Philip who would like the code will be able to get that from Laura, office administrator in the church office. Additionally, one-time users of the building will be provided a temporary code for entrance during their event. With this change we hope to have a bit of reset after years of keys being issued and not returned as well as

simplifying procedures for all the folks who count on St. Philip for space for ministry.

PLEASE NOTE: AFTER THE NEW LOCKS ARE INSTALLED YOUR CURRENT ST. PHILIP KEY WILL NOT WORK ON EXTERIOR DOORS. The building key will continue to work on interior doors for now.
