- Bible study still happens virtually.
- We are providing utility assistance to people whose employment status has changed please let one of the pastors know if you fall into this category we want to help.
- Book studies still happens virtually.
- Youth group still gathers digitally to share in community, fun, and prayer.
- Musical gifts are shared remotely and AMAZINGLY pieced together for worship.
- St. Philip graduates will receive a small gift from the congregation celebrating their accomplishments even as typical celebrations are postponed.
- Phone calls, notes, and check ins are happening like never before.



more! We continue to keep our eyes open for ways that we can utilize this seed money to do God's work in the world. If you have an idea for an action team, please let one of the pastors know!


#### Congregational Meeting Postponed

The Congregational Meeting to elect Council members that is normally held in April has been postponed until Church Council is able to reschedule for another time. There are no

provisions in our current Constitution that would allow the congregation to conduct a vote WITHOUT holding an in-person meeting. In other words, we can't conduct any sort of remote electronic vote. In the meantime, of the four outgoing council members, three have agreed to remain in their council roles until the meeting can be

rescheduled and an election can be held. The Council has determined this to be the best course of action to enable the Council to continue to look after the affairs of the congregation and meet the requirements of our constitution and bylaws.


