New Membership Database is a "Breeze"

In January, the staff and church council

began exploring new options for managing St. Philip's membership roll, the church directory, email lists, and contribution records. Since 2016 the church office has used a church management system called PowerChurch, which while robust in it's own right, had limitations for multiple users. Pastor Laura introduced a newer church management system called Breeze.

One of the highlights of Breeze is that more than one person can use parts of the system at a time, which means regardless of where a staff member or volunteer is working home, office, or on the road - the information in the database can be accessed. Another exciting feature of Breeze is that congregation members can also create an account and access a church directory straight from their phones or computers.

What can congregation members do with Breeze?

- Access church directory information on a computer at https:// stphiliplutheran.breezechms.com or download an app for Android and iPhone by searching "Breeze CHMS." (The icon looks like a sailboat).
- Update their own information as soon as it changes.
- Search for contact information for other active congregation members.

How does it work?

•

- Once you access Breeze either by computer or by app, create an account. The church's id is stphiliplutheran. If there is a profile in Breeze that matches your name and email address, Breeze will sent you an email with an invite link. (If you do not receive your invite link and have more than one email address, please check with Laura Latham in the church office to be sure we have your preferred email address on file.)
- Go to "People" and search for your name.
- Once there, edit your information (if needed) by mousing over or placing your finger on the grey box that says "Main" and "Contact."
 - Upload a photo of yourself and a photo of your family!
 - For individual photos, click on the profile image, select the photo you'd like to use from your device, adjust the photo as needed, click "set as profile picture."
 - For family photos, mouse over the grey box that says "Family"" and click to edit section. Upload photo as above.
 - (Please only upload photo of you and/or your family. These images will be seen by other members who may need help connecting faces and names.)
 - Search for other active congregation members by going to "People" and searching their name.

Church Council News – July 2020

Council met on Tuesday, July 9, 2020 at 7:00 pm via Zoom.

The Treasurer's report showed receipts for month ending June 30, 2020 of \$13,739.59 and year-to-date budget under \$15,782.88. Peter Shick reported \$7,904.00 of monthly receipts was contributed through VANCO payments. Year-to-date receipts through June 30, 2020 were \$135,629.10 and year-to-date expenses were \$111,116.29 after being reduced by \$34,625.00 credit for payroll expenses through the CARES Act Payroll Protection Plan grant funds. If St. Philip had not had the grant funds the loss for June would have been \$10,699.00 and the year-to-date loss would have been \$10,112.00. The **CARES Act Payroll Protection Plan** grant funds of \$8,182.00 that remain will be used to reduce July expenses. Dave and Abby Mellon have assumed the Financial Secretary duties. Council thanks Betty Holland for her service as Financial Secretary for the last three years.

Following the recommendations outlined in a report from Liz Leonard council voted to not open the preschool for the 2020-2021 school year. A letter was sent to all preschool families informing them of the decision.

Council voted to adopt amended changes to the Constitution as

presented to Council and present the approved amended changes to the Constitution to the congregation at the next congregational meeting.

Pastor Laura reported the congregation raised \$850.00 toward the goal of \$1,500.00 for the Minnick School internet access project for the students and teachers. The church will add an additional \$650.00 and send a check to the Minnick School for \$1,500.00.

An article for the newsletter will be forthcoming about a new church management database called Breeze. (See first page) The article will include some instructions on how to update a member's information, add photos, and search contact information for other members. The Financial Secretary now is using Breeze to enter financial contributions.

Shannon Radmacher reported the first drive-up worship service was held in June and was successful. The next drive-up service is Sunday, July 12. A two-question survey was been sent out to the congregation about returning to in person services. So far there have been 56 responses and the survey closed July 12. Pastor David reported because of the summer heat beginning August 2 the drive-up service will be held at 9:30am and the virtual service will be at 11:00 am. (See front page). He also reported the virtual services will continue on-line at this time and we may possibly go to two drive-in services in the fall. Three social

distancing style congregational picnics have been scheduled on the back lawn of the church for July 11, August 8 and August 22 to reconnect with members of the congregation. Everyone is welcome. Bring your food and drink along with a chair or blanket and a mask to wear when not eating.

A letter was sent to Pastor David on June 16, 2020 from Gary Sahm, Council President congratulating Pastor David on his twenty-year anniversary as Pastor of St Philip Lutheran Church. At the February council meeting, council members voted and approved to earmark \$5,000.00 for a gift to a benevolence of Pastor David's choice in honor of his service. Pastor David told council he was very surprised by the recognition, and that he appreciated it. He stated he gives thanks to the people of St Philip and it has been a privilege to serve. He has not yet decided who will receive the donation.

Pastor David will be on two weeks of vacation starting July 12 after the drive -in service. Pastor Laura will be present during his absence.

Rod Dillman contacted the company who originally installed the carpet in the sanctuary and they have not responded. He is now contacting others for estimates to repair the carpet where it has buckled.
