

Make connecting with your church community a "Breeze"

Have you checked out the new church database and directory application called Breeze yet? If not, this is a fantastic way for you to help you stay in touch with your St. Philip community without needing to call around for a person's contact information or dig out a church directory that may be out of date.

You can also keep your own contact information current as it changes. If you moved, got a new phone or a new email address, or added a member of the family, it's easy to enter or update that information as it happens. This helps others and the church office communicate with you better.

Be sure to check out Breeze! Access church directory information on a computer at https://stphiliplutheran.breezechms.com or download an app for Android and

iPhone by searching "Breeze CHMS." (The icon looks like a sailboat). Once you access Breeze create an account. **The church's id is stphiliplutheran**. If there is a profile in Breeze that matches your name and email address, Breeze will send you an email with an invite link. If you do not receive your invite link and have more than one email address, please check with Laura Latham in the church office to be sure your preferred email address is on file.

Thrivent Action Teams

Church Council News

Linda Duncan Rhodes

Council met on Tuesday, February 9, 2021 at 7:00 pm via Zoom.

The Treasurer reports receipts for month ending January 31, 2021 of \$27,673.18 and year-to-date receipts of \$27,673.18 which is \$1,673.18 over budget. The church's expenses for the month were \$26,888.07 leaving \$785.11 more in revenue than spent. The annual withdrawal from the Davenport Investment Fund in the amount of \$17,000.00 was made and deposited in the saving account pending disbursement for approved uses.

St Philip will not qualify for the second round of the Payroll Protection Program in 2021.

The changes made to the Endowment Fund guidelines have been approved by council and will be presented at the spring congregational meeting. The \$17,000 annual distribution from our Endowment Fund was received in January, and Council approved the allocation of these funds in 2021 as follows:

- \$3000 Capital Improvements/ Facilities & Property Various capital projects: fixing lights underneath the portico and painting the preschool rooms.
- \$4000 Maintenance New Lawn

- Mower(s) requested by Pete Schick.
- \$4050 Internal Congregation
 Ministry Seed Money Ministry
 opportunities that will be visioned
 in a council retreat in April
- \$5950 Generosity Outside the Congregation (Benevolence)
- \$2,500 Donation to Malawi suggested by Global Missions Team
- \$2,450 Donation to Virginia Synod to cover 2020 shortfall
- \$1,000.00 To be announced at a later date
