Church Council News

Linda Duncan Rhodes

Council met on Tuesday, March 9, 2021 at 7:00 pm via Zoom.

The Treasurer report showed receipts for month ending February 28, 2021 of Council will participate in a Council \$17,187.79 and year-to-date receipts of \$44,860.97 which is \$7,099.03 under budget. There were no unusual expenses in February. Expenses for the month were \$23,763.54, which was \$6,575.75 more than income received for February. Year-to-date expenses are \$50,651.61 which is \$5,790.64 more than the year-to-date income received.

The special offerings for the Super Bowl of Caring were \$1,429.00. This was donated to Feeding America

Southwest Virginia. A contribution was made to the Virginia Synod in the amount of \$2,450.00 from the 2020 Endowment Fund Allocation as approved by council at the February 2021 council meeting.

Retreat on Saturday, April 24 from 9:00-noon. This retreat has tentatively been set to be held via Zoom.

A congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, April 25 following the drive-up worship service to review and vote on the changes made to the Endowment Guidelines and to vote on new council members.

Council discussed return to in-person worship. Council members asked if the COVID Preparedness Team could

meet and review the details and protocol previously discussed on returning to in-person worship and make necessary changes if needed. The team will present their recommendations at the April council meeting.

When making final arrangements, parishioners will often contact the church or the pastors to ask if they will do their funeral. Going forward, when asked, St. Philip will agree to do the service. When someone dies, one, or both, of the pastors will conduct the service and provide pastoral care for the family. Who conducts the service will be up to discretion of the pastors.

The next council meeting will be held on April 13 at 7:00 pm via Zoom.
