The Treasurer's report showed receipts for the month ending January 31, 2022 of \$33,606.32 and year-to-date receipts of \$33,606.22 which left a surplus of \$8,253.72. Expenses for the month ending January 31, 2022 were \$25,892.06 and were under our monthly income by \$7,714.16. Year to date expenses by \$7,714.16. Adult Faith Formation - Jesus ascending into heaven. The Holy Spirit blowing in like

Acts has 28 chapters, so if you miss a day, don't worry – you don't need to read a book a day to finish by the end of Lent.

And just as the early church described in Acts was a community that gathered to explore, share and grow in faith, we also plan to gather on Sunday mornings, starting March 16 at 10:45am to do the very same thing as we unpack together our experiences reading this amazing story of living grace; living faith.
