Passing the Peace

Sharing God's peace is not simply offering a friendly hello to those sitting around you (though hospitality at the Passing of the Peace is a wonderful sign of grace). The "exchange of peace" is an act of reconciliation that serves as a transition point between the Word and Meal portions of the liturgy. The exchange of peace is a ministry, an announcement of grace we make to each other, a summary of the gift given to us.

That the sharing of the peace follows the prayers of the church is not accidental. Having been forged into a common people in Holy Baptism, the congregation prays for peace in the Church, peace in the world, and peace for all those in need. Then the congregation follows through with the people offering peace and reconciliation to one another. This is not human peace alone, but the peace which is possible only through Christ. Then, after the exchange of peace, we receive the gift of Christ's peace in our sharing Holy Communion.

Council met on Tuesday, November 8, 2022 at 7:00 pm in person and via Zoom.

Pastor Laura met with Renae Taylor about the Community Outreach Pilot. The program went well and opportuni-

Pastor Laura reported on another upcoming Blood Drive on December 19. The Red Cross depends on St. Philip for being one of their primary locations in the Roanoke Valley for blood donations. Digital outreach continues to be one of the strongest more recently emphasized parts of the St. Philip Ministry. To enhance and grow that part of our communication, St. Philip has added some additional resources for ideas and content from Mother Hen Media Ministries.

Fall Faith Formation is continuing and Communion Faith Formation will take place in the coming weeks. Blessing of Animals, Socktober and Trunk or Treat were all held. Feast at Philips is coming soon and volunteers are needed.

Pastor David reminded us of estate planning and education available from Sister Marianne Brock who was here last month. Youth Ministry is moving forward with events planned once a month. Endowment disbursement applications will be received for the annual 4% distribution through December 31.

Pastor Laura met with Renae Taylor about the Community Outreach Pilot. The program went well and opportunities were identified. There is no commitment for the future and the plan is to talk again in January.

Spending Plan for 2023 was reviewed and was approved to present this to the congregation for consideration. Be on the lookout for a congregational communication with details for our congregational meeting December 11 at 10:45am.

Council Retreat was held October 23 and more follow-up is planned for the December meeting. The St. Philip Council is looking to focus on 2 new initiatives connecting us with the values of Welcome and Care as well as identifying 2 current practices that we might conclude.

Treasurer's Report by Peter Shick shows receipts in October of \$22,847 and YTD of \$227,211 which is \$26,314 below budget. Expenses for October were \$26,689 and YTD of \$249,083 or \$4,442 below budget. YTD October deficit is \$21,871.

The next council meeting will be December 13.

Stuff Stockings to Fill Backpacks

Every week of the school year, bags of food are packed and delivered to schools for children in need to take home. With these bags securely in their backpacks, students do not have to worry about where their food will come from over the weekend. Instead of that worry, they can focus on just being kids. The Elijah's Backpack coordinators are extremely resourceful in their efforts to provide high quality foods to children.
