

What's That About? Have you ever wondered during worship about . . .

The Word - What scriptures will be read? Who chooses?

To give a full breadth of scripture readings are assigned each week following a 3 year cycle called the "lectionary". This lectionary was developed by biblical scholars to include readings from the Old Testament, the Psalms, the New Testament other than the Gospels, and one reading from one of the four Gospels. The intention of these assigned texts is to tie together the long story of God speaking to the faithful AND is assigned so that the church might not only hear from favorite scriptures but also from some of the ones that challenge us and make us wonder.



HABITAT FOR HUMANITY HOUSE BUILD - St. Philip has two assigned days to help with the Habitat House Build: Friday, May 19th and Saturday, July 22nd, from 8am-2pm. Once other churches sign up for days, we may be able to add more. The minimum age is 16 and no experience is needed. The Apostles Build is Habitat-Roanoke's special bi-annual project where local churches of all sizes and denominations come together to fund and build a home for a local family. This is not a free home. The homeowner does purchase this home from Habitat, but the Habitat program ensures that the purchase is affordable. The homeowner family provides "sweat equity" by working on their own home as well as the homes of other families. They also participate in mandatory classes to prepare them for homeownership. The Habitat process usually takes 14-18 months for most families.

The 2023 Apostles Build home will be built at the corner of Jamison and 11th Street SE, Roanoke 24013, the former site of Belmont Christian Church (now across the street). The homeowners will be Aubrey Wood and her 12 year old son, Ryden.

After a St. Philip Council retreat in September, our leadership team here has been actively discerning ways we might respond to God's call to ministry in a new and exciting time for the whole church and for us at St. Philip. With lots of good conversation, visioning, dreaming, and praying the St. Philip Council honed in on pursuing ministry ideas connecting us to our shared values of being a congregation of Welcome and Care.

Everything changes very quickly these days, but for the coming 12 months our leadership team hopes to initiate ministry of CARE by cultivating a partnership with Minnick Schools. Minnick Schools are an entity of our Lutheran Social Services arm of the church in Virginia (Encircle). The Minnick School serves students who for a variety of reasons do not learn and grow very well in the public school system. Many of Minnicks students experience life somewhere on the spectrum of autism. There are a number of possibilities to be explored including:

Helping provide some extracurricular activities; students have no routine provision for art or music; Helping with some of the basic needs of students ranging from food to hygiene products; Other possibilities as we are intentional about cultivating relationships
