The Meal: The Lord's Supper - Holy Communion Acts 2:42

⁴²They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.



Explanation:

From the very beginnings of Christianity, when followers of Jesus met in one another's houses to worship, the people gathered for a meal together. Our meal includes an offering of our gifts to God – just as the people of Israel and the very first Christians gathered offerings to God to give thanks to God and to care for those in need in their communities. Our communion meal involves now – just as it involved in those first house gatherings – the sharing a bread and wine in remembrance of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. We gather to celebrate Christ's presence with us – in, with and under the bread and wine of communion. We are fed by Christ's presence and strengthened to be sent out from this place to live our lives in love for God and in love for one another. In the Lutheran tradition communion is typically served whenever God's people gather together for worship.

Love to sing? Want to use your gift to serve others in a meaningful way? Please consider joining the Carilion Clinic Hospice Choir. The choir sings for hospice patients at the request of their families, using our voices to provide comfort to the spirit and psyche of those who are dying. The choir sings for patients in small, a cappella groups of 4-5 sharing music specially composed for this purpose as well as traditional favorites.

Council News -- May 2023

Karen Lowdon, Council Secretary

Council met on Tuesday May 9 in person and via Zoom.

Council welcomed newly elected members Ellen Mehalic, Sue Huntington and Dedi Spradlin. Bruce Johnson was re-elected for a second term. Elected as officers for May 2023-April 2024 were Paul Economy as Council President, Ellen Mehalic as Council Vice President, Peter Shick as Treasurer and Karen Lowdon as Council Secretary.

Daniel Hickox-Young will be moving to Minnesota and council appointed Kendra Meighan to fill the last year of his term. We thank Daniel for his service and for being on council.

The Welcome Task Force is continuing to determine ways to welcome and engage others in the digital community. Shannon Radmacher is leading the group which has also addressed some technical issues and improved processes.

The Care Task Force worked to send over \$400 from our Easter noisy offering to the Boys and Girls Club. A Minnick School Partnership focuses on providing art to students in this ELCA supported learning environment.

Mold remediation in the hallway entrance is in process.

A Solar Energy Task Force is reviewing possibilities of utilizing solar power.

A Summer Camp and Education Program is being evaluated which would use our classroom space during mid-June to early-August.

Child care on Sunday mornings began May 7 and will continue with volunteers during the summer and then two Hollins University students in late August.

Pastor Laura returned to work on May 1 and we welcome her back.

Pastor David reported he is grateful to have Pastor Laura return as a vital part of the ministry team. He is working with others to update job descriptions. Stewardship Emphasis culminated May 7 with Consecration Sunday when intent cards were returned.

Treasurer's Report

April receipts were \$21,498, YtTD \$89,237, \$16,044 under budget.

April expenses were \$25,033, YTD \$104,604, \$677 under budget.

The deficit for April is \$3,086, YTD \$15,367.

The cash balance is \$17,152.

We made a withdrawal of \$15,000 from the staff addition fund.
