all the saints who have gone before us. It's a somber time to reflect on those dear ones we miss so much and a celebration of the unity we share in Christ - in life and in death!




Thank you to everyone who made Trunk or Treat such a fun event! Lots of excitement and candy was shared and many children enjoyed a safe evening of Halloween fun!
