





Treasurer's Report OCTOBER, 2023

OCTOBER RECEIPTS WERE \$28,251 YTD \$228,649 \$34,553 UNDER BUDGET

OCTOBER EXPENSES WERE \$27,182, YTD \$261,524, \$1,677 UNDER BUDGET THE GAIN FOR OCTOBER IS \$1,069 YTD THE DEFICIT \$32,875 THE CASH BALANCE IS \$14,787.

EXPENSES CONTINUE TO BE UNDER BUDGET, THE PROBLEM CAUSING THE DEFICIT IS LOWER THAN BUDGETED OFFERINGS.

ELIJAH'S BACKPACK IS ENCOUNTERING HIGHER COSTS FOR FOOD AND MORE STUDENTS IN NEED THAN IN PREVIOUS YEARS. WE ARE REQUEST-ING \$4,000 FROM THE 2022 ENDOWMENT FUND ALLOCATION TO COVER THE PROJECTED CASH SHORTAGE.

St. Philip Endowment Grants for Ministry

We are blessed. The St. Philip Endowment Fund is an incredible resource for ministry. During the past decade disbursements from this fund have made possible so much ranging from benevolent contributions to partners locally, nationally, and globally, to seed money for new ministries like our digital worship, to capital improvements, and much more.
