As we continue to celebrate Christmas and the Epiphany that Christ has come to bring good news to people everywhere, we at St. Philip hope to continue to explore God's holy connections. Keep paying attention to the places and spaces in your own lives where God's intention for relationship building takes shape.

Building Community Adult Faith Formation Bible Study

As a part of our theme and intention of Building Community, our Adult Faith Formation on Sunday mornings will dive into conversations about how living in community with one another changes us. The apostle Paul writes in the book of Romans: Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God— what is good and acceptable and perfect. —Romans 12:2

Flowing from Paul's directive to the church in Rome, we plan to use a bible study based curriculum called. Transformed Community: Freed and Empowered for Radical Welcome. The kind of transformation Paul is talking about, change that requires the "renewing" of minds, is not easily come by. It demands that we not conform to this world but rather live counterculturally. This kind of faithfulness requires a group effort! This study will focus on the nature and character of Christian community—what kind of change it makes in the world and also how it challenges its individual members, even as it sustains them, in the work of living with

radical generosity, inclusion, compassion, justice, and forgiveness

God and for St. Philip. His gift of himself to St. Philip is so appreciated.


