#### A Stewardship Message

On Sunday, June 22nd, we will celebrate Consecration Sunday. Please highlight this date and make every effort to attend worship this day. This is the Sunday that we ask each member of our church family to respond to an important question:

Church Council met on Tuesday May 13 in person and via Zoom.

The Solar Energy Program is completed and we are realizing significant savings--our power bill dropped from \$1080 to \$180 in March and \$78 in April.

New Council members are Brent Ferguson and Maribeth Schermer. Council elected for the coming year: Ellen Mehalic as President, Dan Radmacher as Vice President, David Melon as Financial Secretary, Max Holland as Treasurer and Karen Lowdon as Secretary.

Pastor David spent a considerable amount of time planning and leading liturgy for the Easter Season, assisting midweek Lenten worship with other churches, identifying someone to lead music weekly and continuing to assist with finding someone for our musician role. He visited 15 homebound people prior to Easter and also sent cards and messages and made phone calls.

The Property Committee is researching updates to our security system, evaluating HVAC issues and the need for painting the outside of the building.

Name tags seem to be well received and many people are using them each Sunday as a way to make connections.


