I hope to eventually go back to graduate school for a Masters degree and my teaching license. No matter what my career, I always look to serve the most vulnerable in the flock.

I currently live right here in Hollins. In my free time, I love making music. I am a singer, a songwriter, and a (very poor) piano player. I love performing my original music with my friend (who is also my former worship pastor). Writing poetry and music is how I feel closest to the Lord and most connected to my joy. I also love dancing with hula hoops and reading books about astrophysics.

I am grateful and excited to be serving St. Philip and our church neighborhood. Pastor David and several of your members have already been so welcoming. I look forward to getting to know your community!

Council met on Tuesday August 12 in person and via Zoom.

Pastor David has been exceptionally busy the past few months with worship planning, newsletter articles, staff search for an office administrator and permanent director of music as well as scheduling substitute musicians. He continues hospital and homebound visits and calls and messages and notes. He assisted with the Blood Drive.

Special thanks to Maribeth Schermer for stepping in to help with office duties over the summer. We appreciate her willingness to fill in and her expertise and efficiency. Thank you Maribeth!!

The property committee has obtained a proposal for updating the HVAC in the fellowship hall and council approved proceeding with that.

The personnel team has reviewed applicants for office administrator and has identified one they would like to extend an offer to. Council approved and Rae Barker began her ministry at St. Philip as office administrator August 18 (Please see front page article introducing and welcoming Rae)

The Stewardship Appeal resulted in 14 intent cards reflected an increase in intended giving over last year. The pool of givers has changed due to moves, deaths and sickness. The amount pledged has decreased yet this was never used as a forecast or to develop a spending plan.

In any given year the intent cards only reflect 50-75% of actual revenue received in the year. The purpose for conducting an annual appeal is to continue to grow a culture of generosity and discipleship among our members. Financial giving is only one way our members contribute.
