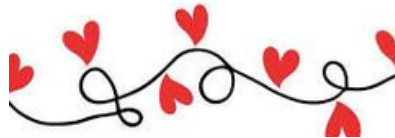

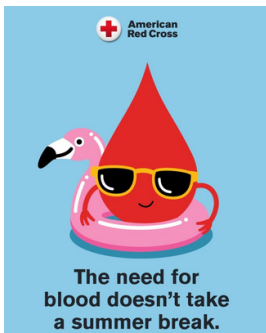

NEW NEIGHBORS COMING NEXT DOOR TO ST. PHILIP

A pending sale of the property directly southwest and next door to St. Philip is slated to be developed with the construction of multiple apartment buildings.

Though the sale is not final, it is very likely that the property will be under construction at some point in the coming months.

There are a lot of questions to be asked and our leadership at St. Philip is in conversation with officials from both Roanoke County and the Virginia Department of Transportation to get as clear a picture as possible as to what impact such a development might have at St. Philip. As details become more solidified, we will plan to share those with the St. Philip family.

Of course, significant development no matter the direct impacts creates change. Ultimately, there seem to be two primary considerations: First, to live out our mission to Love, Feed, and Serve as we literally expect a significant number of new neighbors next door to our facility. Second, for St. Philip to continue to do what we are doing by meeting with all parties involved in the development project and advocate for the best interests of St. Philip.

STEWARDSHIP REPORT ON CONSECRATION SUNDAY MAY 17, 2026

Our Financial Secretary reports the following results on our recent annual financial appeal:

Out of 87 households that were mailed an Intent Card, 41 completed cards were submitted on Consecration Sunday or shortly thereafter. This compares to 49 cards received in 2025.

The annualized amount of these cards totals \$139,890.
This compares to a 2025 amount of \$155,301; a decrease of \$15,411.

Of the 41 Intent Cards submitted, 8 reflected an increase of giving over last year.

And we received 3 Intent Cards from our new members.

The Stewardship Team would like to THANK all those who participated and submitted an intent card this year.

We also are very thankful for the abundance of generosity that takes place at St. Philip that is NOT reflected in the Intent Cards. The faithful givers who, for whatever reason, do not choose to submit an Intent Card; those who generously volunteer their time and talents in a myriad of ways; and numerous members that offer “in-kind” supplies or services out of their own pockets and never seek reimbursement!

And a special shout out to all who filled out a “What Makes Your Heart Sing” card that could be posted in our narthex, or who posted comments on social media.

Please take the opportunity to read some of these on your next visit to church.

COUNCIL HAPPENINGS

Council met June 9 in the church library and over Zoom.

Council spent some time discussing the impacts of the potential sale of the property next door to the church and then subsequent development of that property building multiple apartment buildings. Leadership from St. Philip is in conversation with Roanoke County and Virginia Department of Transportation about possible impacts for St. Philip.

Reports from the property team and stewardship team were received. Ongoing property projects include: some removal of dead trees, potential reimagining of the church office space, and painting the church exterior.

New Office Administrator Kimberly Garriott begins work at St. Philip starting Tuesday, July 7.

St. Philip received the tax credit refund upon the installation of our solar panels and have since paid the remaining balance to SunDay Solar. Our solar installation continues to provide electricity for our building and the church parsonage reducing electric bills by 93% prior to the solar installation.

Church Council voted to compensate Ministry Associate for Worship Donita Moore for the additional work she has done in the absence of an office administrator.

The next church council meeting will be held on August 11 in the church library. Any are welcome to attend.

SHARE A RECIPE

Chicken and Cream of Celery Soup

Spray frying pan and quick fry ½ cup red or green pepper and ⅓ cup chopped onion

Fry five boneless skinless chicken breasts until brown (about 10 minutes)

Mix 1 tsp lemon juice and 1 can cream of celery (or cream of chicken) soup with ½ cup milk or water

Add 1 cup sliced mushrooms or corn

Simmer for 8 minutes

Bake in 350 degree oven for about 1 hour

I love to garden, mostly flowers, but also a few vegetables. I'm not very good at it, but I love the feel and smell of the dirt, I love to nurture the plants, I love the beautiful blooms, and I love the lush green of the foliage.
